



No Helmet Permission Slip

Under current BNJCA rules, the wearing of 2 pads, gloves and a protector is compulsory protective equipment for all players while batting. In addition, these rules state that when batting, the wearing of helmets is highly recommended, however not compulsory.

At FDCC, the safety and protection of our players is paramount. As such, our Club Coaches and Managers are responsible for ensuring that pads, gloves and protector are worn by all players while batting. They also have the authority of the club to insist on the wearing of helmets while the players are in their care. This authority may only be waived if a player's parent or guardian completes and signs the following form.
